## **Course Description**

Music Appreciation introduces students to the fundamentals of music through a comprehensive study of music history, theory, and practical application. The course is designed for students to engage directly with musical concepts through hands-on keyboarding, composition, and performance. Students will explore a wide range of musical genres and periods, from early music to contemporary styles, while developing their aural skills, music literacy, and creative expression.

# **Grading Policy**

QUIZZES & TESTS (60%) - Quizzes and Tests are in the form of a few elements that include but not limited to listening logs, compositions, and end of unit tests.

*CLASSWORK (35%)* – Much of the classwork grade will come from participation in daily activities. Great participation implies that a student demonstrates a positive attitude, a willingness to follow instruction and assist others, and be a responsible member of the class.

HOMEWORK (5%) - The Instructor will, from time to time, assign outside work such as practicing, listening, online exercises, etc.

## Scope & Sequence

- Unit 1: The Building Blocks of Music Introduction to foundational music theory, including rhythm, grand staff and an introduction to the piano.
- Unit 2: The Baroque Period (c. 1600-1750) Exploration of Baroque music, composers, and keyboard techniques.
- Unit 3: The Classical Period (c. 1750-1820) & The Romantic Period (c. 1820-1900) Focus on the Classical style, form, and prominent composers like Mozart and Beethoven. Also, emotional expression and programmatic music in the Romantic era.
- Unit 4: Keyboard Skills and Technical Proficiency Intensive practice on keyboarding techniques, scales, chords, and arpeggios.
- **Unit 5: Music in Movies** Exploration of how music sets the tone in movie scenes, including foley artists and sound effects.
- Unit 6: 20th and 21st Century Music Examination of modern musical styles, including impressionism, atonality, and minimalism.
- **Unit 7: Music of the Americas** An exploration of jazz, blues, rock and roll, and other American musical traditions.
- Unit 8: World Music Survey of diverse musical cultures from around the globe.
- **Unit 9: Composition and Arrangement** Application of music theory to create original compositions and arrangements.
- Unit 10: Final Performance and Portfolio A culminating project where students perform a piece and present a portfolio of their work.
