Information is organized from general to specific, etc.	The "Problem" is explored fully. Predictions of content are realistic. Possible interviews identified. Gives enough reason for the viewer to care

Part Three: Learn	Does not conclude. No ending or completing ideas present	Ideas forming. Incomplete. More info needed	Concluding ideas create completion.	Strong and clear lesson learned. The viewer knows what will happen next or there is a call to action. Strong sense of completion/conclusion
