



The teacher observes and documents your child's interactions during the school day. He or she chooses the appropriate dimension and will fill in the circle that is aligned with his or her observation.



What is a color band and what does it mean?


Our assessment system is geared for children from stages birth to 3rd grade.

How you can help support your child at home

Keep a copy of these objectives and dimensions handy to help scaffold your child to the next level

- Engage in back and forth conversations with your child
- Incorporate at least 15 minutes of movement into your day
- READ or listen to a story everyday with your child!
- Use everyday experiences to reinforce math skills, language development, and literacy
- Encourage your child to use various writing tools to practice fine motor skills
- Allow for your child to engage in imaginative PLAY!!!!
