Domain 2a: Creating an Environment of Respect and Rapport

Teachers create an environment of respect and rapport in their classrooms by the ways they interact with students and by the interaction they encourage and cultivate among students.

• An important aspect of respect and rapport relates to how

- An important aspect of respect and rapport relates to how the teacher responds to students and how students are permitted to treat and speak to one another.
- In a respectful environment, all students feel valued and safe.

#### Indicators:

Respectful talk amongst students; respect for and knowledge of students' lives outside of school; encouragement; politeness; mutual respect; genuine warmth and caring; student-friendly objectives

#### What can you do?!

- Greet your students at the door!
- Acknowledge student's achievements (in and out of the classroom → making a team, getting honor roll, etc)
- Encourage positive student to student discourse
- Create, model, and support an environment where students are not afraid to make mistakes; emphasize GRIT!

# Tips and Tricks

(For any content area)

Turn-and-Talk

What is it? A strategy where students are able to speak to a peer near them, express their ideas, exchange their thoughts, and

share answers to a posed question.

Why should I try it? It gives students a chance to verbally express their thoughts while everyone has a chance to participate in the discussion. Students will learn to think critically and provide helpful feedback to their peers. This strategy also serves as a scaffold for struggling learners. They can "write in the air" before responding to text or writing a composition.

How do I start? Pose a question or ask students to reflect on the topic being taught. Ask students to discuss via "turn and talk".

# What are some strategies I can use with Turn-and-Talk?

- Provide students with sentence starters OR prompt auestions to help scaffold their discussions
- "Share Out" where students share partner's answers
- Use a timer to keep students on track!
- Give each partner a lens or focus for their conversation
- Use accountable talk for effective student dialogue
