A letter was recently sent to everyone advising you of the possibility of having to go to remote instruction, because of a recent increase in COVID-19 cases throughout the community.


As a result of our continued monitoring and review of a very fluid situation, Perth Amboy Public Schools in collaboration and guidance with the local health department and support of the Middlesex County Superintendent of Schools, has made the decision to return to remote instruction upon our return from the holiday break beginning Monday, January 3, 2022. Remote instruction will be in effect for students and staff, with the exception of those designated staff members that were required to report to work during prior remote instruction. Staff members required to report to work will receive a notification from their Supervisor. The expectation is that we will remain on remote instruction for two weeks, and will return to in-person instruction on Tuesday, January 18, 2022. If we are required to remain on remote instruction for longer, we will advise via another communication.

You will be receiving further correspondence from Dr. Vivian Rodriguez, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction and Mr. Delvis Rodriguez, Assistant Superintendent of Administration regarding pertinent information as it relates to remote instruction and operations during these two weeks.
