<u>Homework:</u> Assignments will always be posted in the classroom; you are responsible for writing them down. Homework will be due the following class unless instructed otherwise. If you do not have your homework the day it is due, you will receive a zero for the assignment. The policy for late submissions, which was stated earlier in this document, will apply.

Reading: It is important to bring your book to class every day in order to participate in Readers Workshop. Notebooks will be kept in the classroom. Be sure to choose a book that you are interested in! We will be working to enhance skills in reading both fiction and non-fiction. Class work assignments will incorporate your reading book and journal entries, so you should expect to be reading daily. Prepare to record any reactions, questions, and comments that you have about your book based on the skills we are working with each week.

You will be responsible to sign out the book you have chosen. There will be a "Check Out" Google Form in Google Classroom. Once you are done reading, please fill out the "Return Form" in Google Classroom. This will help me keep track of the books that are in our library!

^{*}Parents should sign up for **Parent Portal** in order to keep up with assignments and grades.

Students are expected to keep the classroom library NEAT and ORGANIZED. All books are properly labeled; return them to their appropriate shelf after you have completed the "Return Form."
You will receive a daily Reading Participation grade during independent practice. If you are off task/disruptive/fake reading, you will lose points for each time this occurs.

<u>Writing:</u> We will be working with the Writers' Workshop Units in order to develop essays. This will be done in an extended amount of time (mostly during class time) and all essays MUST be turned in on time; they are counted as test grades .
Keep in mind that there will be a writing process. In cases where you must plan or map out your essays, you will receive credit for these assignments as well.
Daily writing entries will be counted as class work grades.
